Another Successful Year For Our Dragon and Bell Boat Teams!

On Wednesday, 24th May, Mr Newman, Mr Osobu and Miss Maranian had the pleasure of taking Sonny, Jake, Trae, James, William, Charlie, Levi, Skye, Mason and Thomas to the annual Bell Boat race at Fairlands Valley Park. 22 other primary schools attended the event and our first timed race started at 11.45am against Fairlands School on Lake 1. As we had some some to fill, the Fairlands team had put on a carousel of activities and we took part in doing some Kayaking on Lake 2. None of our children had done this activity before, but they all got their life jackets and safety helmets on , got into the Kayaks, listened to a short training speech from one of the instructors and off they went. The children loved every second and they managed to control their Kayaks perfectly.



11.15am , we left the Kayaking and headed towards Race Control to register our team for the 11.45am race. All the children were very excited. We arrived at Race Control, the children put on their jackets and then 'lock and loaded' into the Bell Boat . The children started their slow row to the top end of the lake. They took this opportunity to get their oars in sync with each other, their timings for when they had to pick up the pace and before we knew it, they were OFF!



As you can see from the picture, we were more than a Bell Boat ahead and finished with a time of: 1.56.47 and Fairlands came in at: 2.23.34.

We made it into the quarter finals and we were racing against our main competition from previous years, Codicote School! After a short rest, the children were back on the water, this time for a winning position, not a time trial. We beat Codicote School Team 2 and we now faced Gravely School in the semi finals. This race went ahead and the children worked so hard to beat Graveley School and succeeded. We were now in the finals, but we were up against Codicote School Team 1! Mr Osobu, Miss Marianan and myself were so proud and excited for the children, they had guaranteed themselves second place and that is where we came! 2nd out of 22 schools, what an amazing achievement! Codicote 1.32.78 Larwood 1.35.37 that's 2.59 seconds in it.! They stuck with Codicote School the entire length of the lake and made them work hard to achieve their 1st place. The Bell boat team achieved 2nd place, they believed in themselves, listened to the



expectations on the day and thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

WELL DONE!

Thursday, 25th May; ENTER THE DRAGONS! It was now time for our Dragon Boat team to compete. Again the same staff had the pleasure of taking: Aiden, Kayson, Harrison, Xander, Chenai, Archie, Kayla, Jasmine, Josie, Tony, Nicholas and Lorenzo to Fairlands to compete in the Dragon boat races at Fairlands Valley Park. The day started off the same as the day before, the children got to take part in an activity on Lake 2, but this time it was in a big row boat. The children were split up in to two groups and both groups were in control of their own boat. This was something new the children hadn't done before and a lot of laughter could be heard across the water.



This activity tired out the children quite a bit, we left Lake 2 and headed back to camp Larwood for a bite to eat and a little down time.



(Well, a bite to eat and some downtime after some more Dragon boat rowing practice from Mr Osobu!) At 11.00am, the entire Fairlands Valley Site held a minutes silence in memory of all those who have lost their lives in the Manchester terror attack. 11.15am, we reported in at Race Control . We were the 10th race of the day out of 12 timed races. We looked at the board at the fastest time was Codicote School with 1.10.69 and we were being timed against Ashtree School. The children got their life jackets on, got themselves into position on the

boat and started the slow row to the top of the lake. During our practice runs on the lake over the last couple of weeks, our fastest time was 1.43.01, the children knew they had some work to do to keep up with the competition and they pulled through! Larwood: 1.16.00 Ahstree School: 1.17.43. We were in the quarter finals, this time facing Mosbury School Team 2. This race was neck and neck all the way down the lake, Walkern and Graveley school were chanting for us 'C'mon Larwood come on, C'mon Larwood! COME ON!', the two boats went over the finish line and the entire area was dead quiet! We didn't know who had won? It went to the adjudicator, who then signaled to the our children they had won and all of a sudden, the silence was broken as the Larwood children cheered out loud! Semi finals next, and we were yet again pitched against Codicote School. The race took place and the children put their hearts and souls into trying to beat Codicote but they

were pipped at the post and Codicote went through to the finals, and we were informed that they had a .05 lead on us. What another amazing day! 3rd place out of 22 other primary schools and like the Bell boat team they ticked every box in our tag line at school of Achieve, Believe, Expect and Enjoy! The Dragon boat team achieved 3rd place, they believed in themselves, listened to the expectations on the day and thoroughly enjoyed themselves. Everyone at Larwood is so proud of the children that took part over the two days. I (Mr Newman) received some great feedback from members of the public on how well the children were behaved and how polite they all were. Thank you to the carers, Grandparents, and parents that managed to come down and support us, it was really nice to see you there supporting the children and the school. 



During the Easter break some of the rooms in House got a coat of paint just


to freshen them up and to make the boarding area more homely and inviting for the boarders.

We would welcome any input from individuals or groups to help us to continue to develop this event and tailor it to the needs of our customers.






