## Read all about it-The Year of The Number!

As we approach the end of our first half term in 2013/14, it is with great pleasure that I am able to write this introductory post for the new look Larwood Lowdown. My thanks go to Mr Newman for this revamp and his work connected to every issue.

As part of my job, it is essential to take stock and reflect upon events as a school year progresses and particularly as it ends. Having done this, and having set various targets at the start of the year, it is possible to draw some conclusions. However, the most important part of the process is then to act upon the conclusions made. Therefore, you will notice the following this year:
$\Rightarrow$ The Year of The Number. Looking at our data which reflects progress in class and attainment in tests for Yr 6 pupils, this is weaker than literacy, during last year. Therefore, we have changed the timetable to allow more time for numeracy.
$\Rightarrow$ Mrs. Kimpton is leading on the Year of The Number. We are running a number of events to encourage greater use of numbers, such as certificates for timetables and a Math Olympics competition
$\Rightarrow$ As mentioned last year, we now have all of our pupils in broad ability groups for both literacy and numeracy sessions

We continue to maintain equal status for literacy and our data from last year demonstrates improved progress and attainment for the majority of pupils during last year in this area.

Whilst both the above are very important, we continue to have our pupils represent Larwood in a variety of sporting events. Year 6 are starting the Arts Award, and we maintain our weekly singing assembly. By the end of this half term, all pupils will be in Houses and will have competed against each other with 'runs' (points) being awarded. Finally, we have some exciting projects taking place during and after half term. This includes more iPads arriving at school so that every child will have access to their own, and some building works. Exciting times ahead.
