

We also had the opportunity to see the animals at Shepreth Wildlife Centre with Mr Jacob's class.


























## Summer Time

## MHOLE SCHOOL

The children of Larwood Primary School in Stevenage recently came up with the wonderful idea of a 'plastic awareness' project. The children challenged themselves and their teachers to collect every piece of single use plastic they used during the day for a period of three weeks and place every item in the recycling bin. Over 10,000 items of plastic from drinks bottles, to straws, yoghurt pots and food packaging were collected and accounted for.



The children were encouraged to take part with the title of 'Captain Plastic' awarded to the individuals in each class who collected the highest number of plastic items. Artist, James Perrett, has supported the school project by offering to create a Captain Plastic hero figure based on the winning child from each class.

Every class collected over 1,000 items with the winners from each class pictured displaying just one week's worth of plastic waste. This includes the waste in the bins pictured behind the children!

The children have been learning about the harmful effects plastic waste is having on our planet and they wanted to make a difference. This project has helped open our eyes to the danger of plastic waste with everyone stunned by how many plastic items we use as a school and learning how we can recycle over 90% of the plastic we use.

## Mr Bcales' Class

As part of our Abracadabra topic we have been looking in to the wonderful world of Wizardry. This new topic approach took place across ours and Miss Trott's classes. It began with a 'stunning starter' where the children took part in a potion making workshop. During the workshop they created a whole host of potions using a range of ingredients.

This whole topic approach has been used as a tool to teach the majority of the curriculum over this half term and the children have managed to conjure up some spellbinding poems, informative potion recipes, wonderful wand designs and creations in addition to playing Larwood's own version of Quidditch to name but a few! Their creations are all stored safely in their Abracadabra topic boxes and I think it's fair to say that their enjoyment for this has been bubbling over!



## MRS OSBORNE'S GLASS

This has been a busy half term, with children working hard inside and outside of class. Circus day was enjoyed by the children who had great fun learning 'circus skills'. Back in class, children wrote about this experience.

In science we have been looking at animals, including humans, and plants. Children have made human skeletons from straws and matched young animals to their mothers. We have talked about how seeds are dispersed by nature and made plant seed heads of our own. We have grown beans and planted flowers in the small playground to brighten it up. In RE, we have been learning about the creation story. Children made creation wheels to show what happened on each of the different days whilst God was creating the world. During maths sessions, children have been collecting data to create graphs. They have practising their times tables and learning about ¼ turns and right angles.













What a great Summer it has been for sport! As a partner school with Stevenage Sporting Futures Team, we've been able to take part in a whole manner of sports this term. If you remember from the last Lowdown edition, I promised to give you the feedback from our Bell and Dragon Boat races that took place in May.

During the beginning part of May, both our Bell and Dragon Boat Teams did a couple of practice rows at Fairlands Valley Lakes. The staff at Fairlands were very impressed with our good behaviour, the children's listening skills, sensible appropriate questions and their determination to do well in this event, like we have over the past few years. Our practice race times were very good and on the day, both teams put their full effort in.

### DAY ONE: THE LARWOOD BELL BOAT TEAM: YEARS 3 & 4

As usual, we arrived first at Fairlands, pitched up our marquee, our sports flags, and our very loud music box! Once all setup, Mr V put some music on, the children started their warm up exercises, and we waited for the other 21 Primary schools to arrive. We were second to race and the first school we went up against was St Nicholas School. We headed to race control, the children got their life jackets on and the race began. We managed to beat Woolenwick School with a fantastic lead, and once back at base, and obviously a victory dance! We settled down for lunch, and we were joined by some of our parents, who came to support us and cheer us on. After lunch, we went into our second race against Peartree School. We didn't win this race, but from the pictures you can see how far they had to row and how well our team did to keep up with them, Peartree School crossed the line 0.66 of a second before us. The children were in good spirits, they shook the hands of the other team and congratulated them and we then cheered on and supported one of the other partner schools; Broom Barns! We all had a great day, the children enjoyed themselves and the year 4's from this group will now be part of the 2019 Dragon Boat team! Well done Larwood Bells, you were all AMAZING!

### DAY TWO: THE LARWOOD DRAGON BOAT TEAM: YEARS S & 6 - ENTER THE DRAGONS

We arrived at Fairlands Valley Park nice and early again to claim our spot, pitch up our marquee and our flags, before the other 21 schools arrived. Mr V then got all the children together and started a warm up dance exercise of 'Musical Statues', this put everyone into good spirits.

Over the years, our Dragon Boat Team have either won this event or at least finished in the top three and this year was no different! The children all worked very well with each other, their behaviour was exceptional, excellent communication skills with each other, great leadership skills, and all round good sportsmanship.

Our first race was against Walkern School, but before we hit the water, this year we all agreed we would try a different approach to Race Day. We had school colour (burgundy) face crayons, so the children had stripes on each cheek, and down the nose; all finished off with a headband! They looked brilliant! We had our race with Walkern School; they got a finishing time of 2.32.75 and we flew into the lead with a finishing time of 1.42.41, which put us straight into the quarter finals! In the quarter finals we then raced Gravely School who got a finishing time of 1.48.78 and again, we won with a great time of 1.33.47. Out of the quarter finals, we got the fastest time over all. We went into the semi finals against St Margarets School who got a finishing time of 1.32.31 and we achieved 1.27.47! Fastest time of the day so far! We were now in the finals, and racing against Codicote School! The children had a short rest period, not as long as Codicote had (I would like to point out) and we hit the final race! Our children had pretty much done three races in a row, their spirits were still high and they were determined to push themselves to the limit to win. The children rowed to the top of the lake, turned the boat around and faced the crowd, after a few minutes, the siren went and they were off! Both teams set off with a strong start, but early on, one of our rowers had their oar knocked out of their hand and we were down to 9 rowers, Codicote were still rowing strong with 10, but we kept up with them all the way to the finish line and then. . . . . . . it was over! The finish was so close we had to wait for the finish time to come in for it to be official. Codicote finish time: 1.24.28 Larwood finish time:1.26.75 Codicote pipped us at the finish line by 0.02.47 seconds. The children were disappointed they didn't win, but after a little 'pick me up' chat they were soon back in great spirits, congratulated Codicote on their win and we went on to the awards ceremony.

The competition at the Dragon Boat race between Larwood and Codicote each year, is on par with the Cambridge and Oxford Boat race! We told the team that considering they had done three races in a row, we were also a rower down, the end result was exceptional! Mr V and I were very proud of the team! We've had a great year working along side the Stevenage Sporting Futures Team and the other local primary schools that are also in the sports partnership.
