School Development Plan - Overview

Mission

Larwood Academy Trust's vision is to be the best provider of outstanding provision for special needs pupils in the country.

During the next three years, our aim is to establish an all through (11-16 and then in time 11-18 formal pathway) educational pathway for SEMH children in the North Hertforshire area. Such provision will be characterised by quality experiences, creative, engaging and personalised curriculum provision that is different to previous failed placements, and a range of supportive systems and processes that are qualified as exceptional and innovative. In short, the best proivision possible and with a national reputation for such quality and outcomes.

During the course of the year our day to day provision will be comprised of:

- -Larwood School day provision for 86 SEMH pupils (many with additional needs)-Primary and based in Stevenage.
- -Larwood School Space Hub for 12 pupils. A specific hub within Larwood school that caters for SEMH pupils with autism. Primary and based in Stevenage
- -Brandles School day provsion for up to 60 pupils pupils with SEMH and a range of additional needs. Secondary and based in Baldock
- -Outreach services for social, emotional and mental health related support for 25 mainstream primary schools within Stevenage
- -On Larwood Site-counselling provision supplied to school and the widr community via The Butterfly Rooms

This includes parents, other professionals such as the Educational Psychologist, Attendance Officer, School Nurse, SEN Officers and Speech and Language specialists. •We model the fact that we never stop learning and engender a love of learning for all, as this is vital for our children and us in the ever changing society that we live in.
