ERGOTRON Hint 1: It's not really about ERGOTRON, but more about what is inside ERGOTRON. They are quite new, and can do many things?

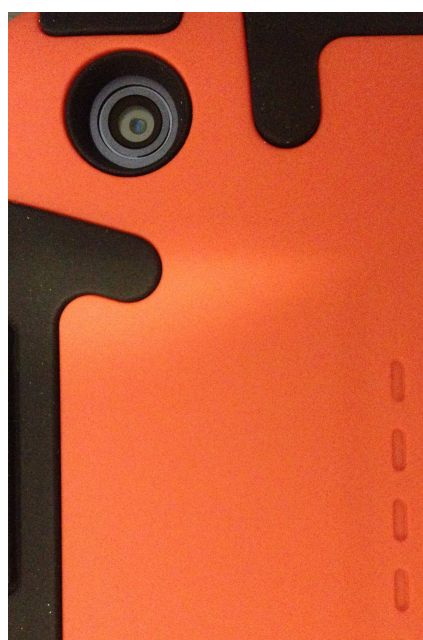


What is ERGOTRON?

Have you heard about the 'Men in Black?'

Did you say no! Never heard of them! Isn't that a film?

The '*Men in Black*' is the name that has been chosen by our pupils in Years 5/6 that are now 'off points'.

Here at Larwood, part of our reward system enables your children to earn points every day, lesson by lesson and during play and lunchtime. During a normal week, every pupil has the chance to get 100 points (20 points per day). Every Friday, during assembly, we celebrate how pupils have responded to this challenge and we award certificates. If a pupil gains 100 points, they are awarded a certificate and given a 'golden ticket'. The ticket gets them an entry into the half term prize draw. There are three prizes and the lucky winners get to choose between items such as a scooter, a skateboard or a robot. Clearly, the more tickets you have in the draw the better chance you have of winning!

When a pupil manages to get 90 plus points every week for 5 weeks, during the sixth week, members of the leadership team and their class teacher have a conversation about whether the pupil concerned is ready to come off points. This means that they take total responsibility for their own behaviour. To show that they are part of the select group, they are given a black polo shirt to wear rather than the normal white one. They also have added options at playtimes and are automatically given 100 points and a golden ticket every week. Along with all of this they now have their very own table at lunchtime without adult supervision and can invite a guest to lunch with them every day. Following a number of weeks the pupils came up with the name, the 'men in black'. I must add that



we can easily have 'women in black' joining the group as well!

We are now considering ways in which we can expand this and start up another reward scheme for those pupils in Years 3 and 4.
