Our current Year 6 pupils will not see such changes, as they move onto new secondary schools in September. Our best wishes go with all of them.

I am very lucky to have such a great team of professionals who have worked tirelessly this year with your children. I also appreciate your support and collaboration in many ways as the year has progressed. I wish you a restful and warm summer holiday and look forward to working with you next year.
